



Carroll Respite Program – What You Need to Know

- Homelessness, addiction and untreated medical conditions are growing concerns in Carroll County.
- The Carroll Respite program offers a structured, secure solution to help medically vulnerable individuals recover and get back on their feet.
- Carroll Respite is an initiative by Access Carroll in partnership with LifeBridge Health.
- A \$5 million grant from Sinai Hospital will fund this initiative, which will serve both Sinai patients and Carroll County residents. Without this partnership, these vital programs would not be available to local residents.
- This program aims to reduces strain on **law enforcement**, **hospitals and emergency services**, helping to keep our community safer.

What Carroll Respite Provides

- Medical Respite Supervised medical care for individuals too sick for a shelter but not requiring hospitalization. This serves as a bridge in their care journey, typically lasting several weeks.
 - Example: A man recovering from a foot amputation who needs wound care before he can safely return to a shelter.
- **Sober Respite** − A safe space **for Carroll County residents** struggling with addiction, providing support instead of jail time or hospitalization. The sober respite program is exclusively for Carroll County residents.
 - Helps reduce police involvement and keeps ERs open for real emergencies.
- Food Pharmacy Healthy, local food and nutrition education to support long-term wellness.

Clearing Up Misconceptions

Myth: Sinai Hospital patients will be left in Carroll County.

✓ Fact: Patients from Sinai return to their home communities when they are medically ready.

• The current pilot program has helped five patients return home, with four more working on their discharge plans.

Myth: People will be able to walk away from the program and onto the streets of Westminster.

✓ Fact: All patients have intensive care management with dedicated resources to ensure they have a plan to return to their home community and other support services. The facility will have 24/7 security to prevent unauthorized departures and ensure safety. No one will be "dumped" into the community.

Myth: This program does not benefit Carroll County.

✓ Fact: Carroll County residents WILL have access to medical and sober respite, helping local people in need. In fact, the sober respite is solely to support Carroll County residents.

Why Carroll County?

- **Selected for Expertise & Compassion** Access Carroll has been **successfully serving** vulnerable populations for 20 years.
- A Community That Cares Carroll County has always helped those in need, rather than pushing them away.

A \$5 Million Investment – A grant from Sinai Hospital will fund services that also benefit Carroll County residents. Nearly \$4 million will cover construction of the facility in the Distillery Building. The remainder of the funds cover operating costs and services. Without this partnership, these vital programs would not be possible for local residents.
